• Teach you how to monitor your blood glucose levels.






• Refer you to a diabetes education session.

Diabetes can lead to health problems

Diabetes causes damage to blood vessels – it can cause:



What you can do:

- Eat 3 meals a day, starting with breakfast.
- Make half your plate colourful vegetables.
- Drink water instead of fizzy and sugary drinks.
- Have fruit instead of cake, biscuits and packet snacks.
- Keep takeaways to once a week or less.
- Eat less by eating smaller serving sizes.



• If you are overweight – try to lose some weight.

• If you drink alcohol, limit the amount you drink as it might affect your blood glucose levels and your weight.





• Keep active and exercise regularly - 30 minutes or more most days.
